Top 10 Energy Tips

- 1. Close storm windows; use drapes and shades at night to conserve heat.
- 2. Close flue dampers on fireplace.
- 3. Install faucet flow restrictors and low-flow shower heads.
- 4. Tune up your heating system.
- 5. Insulate, caulk, and weather-strip your home.
- 6. Remove and vacuum your furnace filter every month; replace it when it can't be vacuumed clean.
- 7. Close and reduce heat in all unoccupied areas.
- 8. Replace 60W incandescent bulbs with 13W CFLs.
- 9. Set your thermostat back.
- 10. Insulate heat pipes and duct work.
